



# The Burmese Cat Club

## BREEDER REGISTRATION

If you would like to place details of kittens on the Club's Kitten Lists, put your stud on the BCC stud-list or be listed on the breeders' page, **please register now** by completing and detaching the form below and sending it to **Mrs Frances Bell, 2 Cornhill Grove, Biggar. ML12 6GN**

You can then give details of your kittens to the relevant Kitten List Compiler. Registration on the Breeders Register is a one-off requirement and your details will be retained on the register as long as you are a fully paid-up member of the BCC and comply with the club's recommendations contained in the Code of Ethics.

The form contains the following declaration:

I undertake to abide by the recommendations of the Burmese Cat Club and sell only registered kittens (registered individually with the GCCF), which are fit, healthy and house-trained. I will not allow them to go to their new homes before thirteen weeks of age and at least seven days after completion of a full course of vaccination for FIE, FVR and FCV ("cat `flu") including a health check, given by a Veterinary Surgeon or by a listed Veterinary Nurse under the direction of a Veterinary Surgeon. In the event of a problem (eg Hypokalaemia) developing after a kitten has gone to its new home I will offer appropriate support to the owner in accordance with advice from the Burmese Cat Club.

There is also a section for stud owners to complete, and a request for permission to use your name and telephone number in response to general inquiries or when there are no kittens available in your Region.

## NOTES

### USING THE KITTEN LISTS

1. The Kitten Lists are for use by fully paid-up members who have completed and returned the Registration Form overleaf. The details are held on the Breeders Register, which is circulated to Regional Advisers, Kitten List Compilers and other members of the Committee.
2. Registrants are expected to abide by the terms of the declaration shown overleaf and to rear their kittens in accordance with the recommendations laid down by the Club.
3. Half-Burmese kittens that are the product of accidental mis-matings will be accepted for entry on the local list at the discretion of the relevant Kitten List compiler provided the breeder undertakes to rear them in accordance with 2. above.
4. It has never been Club policy to include progeny from deliberate hybrid matings, and these kittens will not be accepted on the list.
5. Full pedigree Burmese kittens bred by non-members will be accepted for entry only if there is an exceptional need to safeguard the kittens' welfare.
6. Details of kittens over the age of four months will be removed automatically from the list unless the breeder requests otherwise.
7. Kittens sold but later returned to the breeder, at whatever age, may be re-advertised on the list.

### SOME GENERAL ADVICE

#### **Please**

1. Devote sufficient time and care during discussions with prospective buyers (as outlined in the BCC leaflet *Selling a Kitten*) to ensure that the kittens are going to suitable homes. The Club refers inquiries in good faith, but can accept no responsibility for the outcome.
2. Consult the stud owner if there is doubt regarding the colour of kittens.
3. Give consideration to insuring the kittens.

#### **At the time of sale**

1. Provide the purchaser with a properly completed pedigree signed by the breeder, showing three generations at least, all the breed numbers and registration numbers, and the breeder's name and address.
2. Provide the purchaser with a GCCF registration transfer form, completed and signed by the breeder.
3. Provide the purchaser with a certificate of vaccination.
